Memes can be a fun way to engage students in learning. Here's how.

1.Introduce a topic

Example: A meme of George Washington crossing the Delaware with a caption like, "When you're leading a revolution and need to pull an all-nighter."

2. Review a concept:

Example: A meme about the Declaration of Independence: "We're breaking up, Britain. It's not us—it's you."

3. Analyze perspectives.

Example: A meme about the Industrial Revolution. Workers and factory owners on making money.

4. Create modern connections

Example: A meme about the Boston Tea Party with a modern twist: "The OG protest against unfair taxes."
